

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, an act authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money for the purpose of repairing the Presbyterian and Lutheran church in Emmitsburg, in Frederick county. A bill entitled, an additional supplement to the act to regulate public ferries. A bill entitled, an act for the benefit of the Baltimore carpenters' Humane society. A bill entitled, an act for the benefit of William Kennedy, of the city of Baltimore. A bill entitled, an act to lay out a road in Baltimore county. A bill entitled, an act to confirm and make valid all the acts done by David Bowler, justice of the peace for Frederick county. A bill entitled, an act for the relief of Sarah Thompson. A bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to authorise the Levy court of Baltimore county, to assess and levy a sum of money for the purpose therein mentioned. A bill entitled, an additional supplement to an act entitled, an act for the appointment of commissioners for the regulation and improvement of Cambridge, in Dorchester county, and to establish and regulate a market in said town, severally passed by that house December 30, 1815. A bill entitled, an act relating to the poor house and public ground thereto belonging, in Cecil county, passed by that house December 21, 1815; and resolutions in favor of Charles Goldsborough, and Joseph Clewley, revolutionary soldiers. Which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion, the question was put, will the senate re-consider the bill entitled, an act to authorise and empower the Levy court of the several counties of this state to lay out public roads in their respective counties? Resolved in the affirmative.

The bill being read the question was put, will the senate postpone the further consideration thereof until to-morrow? Resolved in the affirmative.

The senate adjourns until to-morrow morning 9 o'clock.

TUESDAY, January 2.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read, Mr. Nabb appeared in the senate.

Mr. Hawkins presented a petition from Sebastiau Graff, and Philemon Towson, praying a law to authorise the sale of certain real property therein mentioned. Which was read and referred to Messrs. Hawkins, Stephen and Johnson, to consider and report thereon.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from the village of New Windsor (Sulphur Springs,) to intersect the Westminster turnpike, (Baltimore and Reisters town turnpike) road, at or near the west end of the town of Westminster. A bill entitled, an act for the benefit of the heirs of John Stevens, deceased, of Worcester county. A bill entitled, an act to incorporate the steam company of Princess Anne. A bill entitled, an act to lay out and make public a road in Dorchester county. A bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Henry Beagley of Frederick county. A bill entitled, an act for the benefit of the heirs of Benjamin Deard, late of Anne Arundel county, deceased. A bill entitled, an act for introducing a copious supply of water into the town of Cumberland. A bill entitled, an act to make public an old road leading from Benjamin Kemp's merchant and saw mills, by the widow Kemp's and Christian Dril's mills, to the road leading from New town (Trapp) to Trabelsburg. A bill entitled, an act to authorise and permit the removal of certain slaves from the state of Kentucky into the state of Maryland, heretofore owned by and in the possession of Richard Ridgely, junior, late of Kentucky, deceased, severally passed by that house January 1, 1816. And the following message:

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, January 2, 1816.

Gentlemen of the senate,

General Charles Ridgely, (of Hampton) having been elected governor of the state of Maryland, and being arrived in this city, we have appointed Messrs. Kilgour and Dickinson, to join such gentlemen as shall be named by your house to wait upon his excellency the governor elect, and request his attendance in the senate chamber, for the purpose of qualifying as directed by the constitution and form of government.

Which were severally read the first time and the bills ordered to lie on the table.

The following message was read agreed to and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

BY THE SENATE, January 2, 1816.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

We agree to your proposal that a joint committee of the two houses should wait upon the governor elect, and request his attendance in the senate chamber for the purpose of qualifying; and have nominated on our part Messrs. Johnson and J. Williams.

The bill entitled, an act to incorporate the stockholders of the Athenian society, was read the second time, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Charles Ridgely, (of Hampton) the governor elect, attending in the senate chamber. Ordered, that Messrs. N. Williams and Brown, inform the house of delegates that Charles Ridgely, (of Hampton) the governor elect, is attending in the senate room to qualify as governor of the state of Maryland, and request their attendance.

The Speaker attended by the members of the house of delegate appeared in the senate room, and Charles Ridgely, (of Hampton) qualified as governor before the president of the senate, in the presence of both houses, by taking the oaths directed by the constitution and form of government, the oath of office prescribed by law, and by taking an oath to support the constitution of the United States; and to by subscribing a declaration of his belief in the christian religion.

The bill entitled, an act to confirm and make valid the deed therein mentioned from Henry H. Brown to Matthias Hammond, was read the second time, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act for the benefit of the heirs of David Gammill, late of the city of Baltimore, deceased, was read the second time, passed with sundry amendments and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The senate adjourns until to-morrow morning nine o'clock.
