### TUESDAY, January 16.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday, except Mr. Frazier. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Messrs. L. Hollingsworth and Kent appeared in the senate.

The bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act for the benefit of the heirs of William Ringgold, of Kent county, was sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act to lay out and open a road in Frederick county, was read the second time, passed with an amendment and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act to give validity to a deed of conveyance from the heirs of John Black to Benjamin Morton, of Baltimore county, was read the second time and will not pass; sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

On motion of Mr. Hebb, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act to reduce into one the several acts of assembly respecting elections and to regulate said elections. Ordered, that Messrs Hebb, Brown and L. Hollingsworth be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Benedict Foster, of Baltimore county. A bill entitled, an act for the relief of Nicholas Boswell, of Montgomery county, severally passed by that house January 15, 1816. A bill entitled, an act to authorise the recording of a certain deed of bargain and sale therein mentioned. A bill entitled, an act for draining a branch of Tuckahoe known by the name of Bever Dam branch lying in Queen Ann's county. A bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Henry Hicks, of Anne Arundel county, severally passed by that house January 16, 1816. A resolution directing the register of the land office for the Western Shore to correct a mistake in the beginning of lot No 3358, lying westward of Fort Cumberland in Alleghany county; and a resolution relative to printing the laws and votes and proceedings of the last session and authorising the governor and council to contract with the printer to the state or some other person for the same, and appropriating for that purpose a sum not exceeding twelve hundred dollars. Which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill entitled, an act relative to the inspection of Tobacco in the city of Baltimore, was read the second time and the question put, shall this bill pass? The yeas and nays being required appeared as follow:

AFFIRMATIVE—Messrs Brown, Fenwick, Hebb, L. Hollingsworth, W. Hollingsworth—5

NEGATIVE—Messrs. Davis, (Pres't) Hawkins, Kent, Nabb, Stephen—5

So it was determined in the negative.

### WEDNESDAY, January 17.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday, except Mr. Fenwick. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill entitled, a supplement to an act respecting a monument or statue to the memory of Washington, was sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, an act relating to the collections of the county taxes in Alleghany county, passed by that house January 16, 1816. A bill entitled, an act to increase the capital stock in the Hager's town bank, passed by that house January 17, 1816; and the following message:

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, January 17, 1816.

Gentlemen of the senate,

We propose with the concurrence of your house to proceed to the appointment of Register of Wills for Frederick county, to fill up the vacancy occasioned by the death of Richard Butler, this day at 10 o'clock. We have appointed Messrs. Johnson and Lecompte, to join such gentlemen as may be chosen by your house to examine the ballots. Messrs. Henry Steiner and Ezra Mantz, are nominated by this house.
