

The bill, entitled, An act to alter the time of the meeting of the general assembly of this state, and for other purposes, was read the second time by special order, and referred to the next general assembly.

The bill, entitled, An act relating to turnpike roads, was read the second and by special order the third time, and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The senate adjourns until to-morrow morning 9 o'clock.

### THURSDAY, February 12, 1818.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday, except Mr. Hollyday, who is indisposed. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act for the preservation of the breed of wild deer in Somerset and Dorchester counties, was read the second, and by special order the third time, and will pass.

On reconsideration of the bill, entitled, A further supplement to the act, entitled, An act for making certain roads in Baltimore and Harford counties, the question was put, Shall this bill pass? Determined in the negative.

The bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of a religious society in Frederick county called The United Brethren, was read the second, and by special order the third time, and postponed for further consideration.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a resolution relative to the public buildings; which was read the first, second and third time, by special order, and the question being put, Shall this resolution be assented to? The yeas and nays being required appeared as follow:

AFFIRMATIVE.

So it was determined in the affirmative.

A resolution in favour of Aaron Simmons; in favour of Solomon Lowe; which were severally read the first time. A resolution in favour of Justinian Mayberry, which was read the first, second, and third time by special order, and dissented from. A resolution directing the register of the land office to issue patents to George D. Parnham and Ann Parnham, for certain lands, was read the first time. And returns the resolution relative to the defence of the Chesapeake bay, endorsed, "by the house of delegates, assented to." Ordered to be engrossed. Also the following bills: a bill, entitled, An act to provide for building bridges over Patuxent river; a bill, entitled, An act for the better regulation of the militia of the city of Baltimore; and the bill, entitled, An act to authorise the justices of the levy court of Anne-Arundel county to appoint some person to take charge of the tobacco now in the old warehouse at Elk Ridge landing; which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table. And returns the bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act to regulate the inspection of salted fish, endorsed by that house, "will pass with the proposed amendments;" which were read and assented to. Ordered to be engrossed.

The bill, entitled, An act to incorporate the Hibernian Society of Baltimore, endorsed by that house, "will pass." Ordered to be engrossed.

The resolution relative to negotiating a loan, was read the second, and by special order the third time, and dissented from. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act to provide for building bridges over Patuxent river, returned by the house of delegates endorsed, "amendments read, and dissented from." Amendments receded from, and the bill returned to the house of delegates.

The bill, entitled, An act to authorise a loan to the state, and for other purposes, was read the second, and by special order the third time, and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act to establish a bank and incorporate a company under the title of The Planters Bank of Prince-George's county, was received from the house of delegates, endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendments;" which were read, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

The bill, entitled, An act declaring what shall be evidence in certain cases therein mentioned, was read the third time and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act to prevent the erection of booths within two miles of any Methodist Camp or quarterly meeting in Anne-Arundel county, was read the second time.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers the following bills: a bill, entitled, An act relating to the police of the city of Baltimore; a bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of Mary Mackubin of Anne-Arundel county; which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The resolutions in favour of the clerks; in favour of the clerk of the council; in favour of John Leeds Kerr; and relative to the naval depot, were severally read the second, and by special order the third time, assented to, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, A further supplement to the act, entitled, An act to establish a bank and incorporate a company under the title of The Bank of Somerset, endorsed by the house of delegates, will pass. Ordered to be engrossed.

The bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Christian Hager, was read the second, and by special order the third time, and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of Levin Craig, infant child and heir of Margaret Craig, late of Dorchester county, deceased, was read the third time and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act for the relief of John Hennis of Allegany county, was read the third time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act to incorporate the Roman Catholic Free School in the city of Baltimore was, on consideration, referred to Messrs. Carmichael, Maxcy and Calvert, to consider and report thereon.

The resolution in favour of George D. Parnham and Ann Parnham, was read the second time by special order. The resolution relative to the treasurer of the eastern shore, was read the first time.

On motion of Mr. Taney, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act relating to coroners and sheriffs, passed at November session 1799. Ordered, That Messrs. Taney, Calvert, and Emerson, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.
