

The bill, entitled, An act for the better regulation of appeals from the several orphans courts in this state, was read the second time.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers the following bills: A bill, entitled An act to authorise the judges of the court of appeals to extend the time of their sessions on the eastern shore, endorsed by that house, "read the first and second time by special order and will pass." Ordered to be engrossed. A bill entitled, An act to regulate the admission of attorneys at law, coming from other states, to practice in the courts of this state; which was read the first, and by special order the second and third time, and will not pass. Returned to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act for the support of Elizabeth Mason, of Saint Mary's county; the bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of Francis Adams, (of John.) of Charles county; were severally read the second, and by special order the third time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act for the preservation of the navigation of a branch of Nanticoke river, called North West Fork, in Dorchester county, and the bill, entitled, An act to appoint Gustavus W. T. Wright trustee to sell and dispose of the lands therein mentioned, were severally read the second time.

On motion of Mr. Taney, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act to regulate the admission of juries in the different courts of this state. Ordered, That Messrs. Taney, Gale and Carmichael, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

The bill, entitled, An act declaring the assent of the legislature to the devise of lands in the will of John Cunningham, late of Harford county, deceased, to Francis Ashbury, William M. Kendree and others, in trust for the Methodist Episcopal Church for the purposes therein mentioned, was read the second, and by special order the third time, and will pass with the proposed amendment, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Amendment proposed. Strike out the words, "A bill, entitled," in the title of the bill.

The bill, entitled, An act for the better regulation of appeals from the several orphans courts of this state, was read the third time by special order, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers the following bills: A bill, entitled, A supplement to an act authorising the levy court of Somerset county to levy and assess a sum of money for certain purposes therein mentioned, endorsed by that house "read the second time and will pass with the proposed amendment;" which amendment was read the first time. The bill, entitled, An act to incorporate a company under the name of The Hydrant Company of Port Tobacco, was read the second time.
