

Amendment proposed. Add the following proviso to the end of the bill: "Provided, the said Peter Guillet shall become a citizen of the United States as soon as he conveniently can, according to the laws of the United States provided in such cases."

On motion, the senate resumed the consideration of the bill, entitled, An act to regulate the several incorporated banks in this state; when, on motion of Mr Carmichael, the further consideration thereof was postponed until to-morrow.

The bill, entitled, An act to repeal so much of the act, entitled, An act to provide for the education of poor children in Kent, Talbot, Cecil, Anne-Arundel and Montgomery counties, passed at December session 1816, as relates to Anne-Arundel and Montgomery counties, was read the third time and passed.

On motion of Mr. Hollyday, The senate proceeded to the election of a senator to fill the vacancy occasioned by the resignation of the honourable Edward M. Calvert. The ballots being deposited in the ballot box, on examination thereof it appeared, that Richard W. West was duly elected. Whereupon it is declared in the senate, that Richard W. West, esq is duly elected. Where upon the president was requested to notify Mr West of his election, and request his attendance at the seat of government to qualify according to the constitution and form of government.

The senate adjourns until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.

WEDNESDAY, January 20, 1819.

The senate met Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read. Mr. Winchester appeared in the senate.

The communication from the executive, with the report of the inspectors of the penitentiary, and the resolution of the general assembly of the state of Ohio; the resolution in favour of Thomas Wright, Robert Wright and Henry Darden; and the bill, entitled, An act to confirm and make valid a deed from Charles G. Dorsey to William Shipley, junior; the bill, entitled, An additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act for founding an Academy at Hagerstown, in Washington county; the bill, entitled, An act to increase the pay of the judges of the orphans court in the counties of Baltimore, Dorchester and Washington; the bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act to incorporate a company for building a bridge over Choptank river, at or near Denton ferry; the bill, entitled, An act authorising Daniel Schnebly, late sheriff and collector of Washington county, to complete his collection, and authorising the levy court to pay him for certain services performed during his sheriffalty; the bill, entitled, An act to repeal so much of the act to provide for the education of poor children in Kent, Talbot, Cecil, Anne-Arundel and Montgomery counties, passed at December session 1816, as relates to Anne-Arundel and Montgomery counties; the bill, entitled, An act to enable Peter Guillet, senior, of Somerset county, to purchase and hold real property in this state; and the bill, entitled, A further supplement to the act, entitled, An act for making certain roads in Baltimore and Harford counties, were sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Mr. Winchester presented the petition of John Patterson; which was read and referred to Messrs. Winchester, Winder and Magruder, to consider and report thereon.

Mr. Winder from the committee reported a bill, entitled, An act to incorporate the Savings Bank of Baltimore; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion of Mr. Gale, the bill, entitled, An act relating to the turnpike road on Jones's Falls, in Baltimore city, was referred to Messrs. Gale, Taney and Winchester, to consider and report thereon.

The bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of Thomas Monnett, and Ann his wife, of Allegany county, was read the third time and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Mr. Carmichael from the committee reported a bill, entitled, An act to authorise Ruth Tolson to complete the collection of John Tolson, her deceased husband, late collector of Queen Anne's county; which was read the first, and by special order the second and third time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers the following bills: A bill, entitled, An act to alter change and abolish, such parts of the constitution and form of government, as relate to the election of the governor and council; a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act relating to the town of Belle Air Harford county; a bill, entitled, An act incorporating a company to erect a toll bridge across the Potomac river opposite Shepherds Town; a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act to confirm the title of Hugh Quigly and John McGreagor, of Harford county, to certain lands therein mentioned; a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Elizabeth Fitzhugh of the city of Baltimore; which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion of Mr. Winder, Ordered, That Messrs. Winder, Taney, Carmichael and Cresap, be a committee to enquire and report whether any, and what measures, ought to be taken by the assembly of this state relative to the turnpike road now constructing by the United States from Cumberland on the Potomac river, to Wheeling on the Ohio river; and that the committee report by bill or otherwise.

On motion of Mr. Gale, the senate resumed the consideration of the bill, entitled, An act to regulate the several incorporated banks in this state; when Mr. Gale moved to amend the amendment moved by him on the reading of the bill on yesterday, by striking out from the word "contained" in the 4th line of the bill the end of the section, and after sometime spent in the discussion thereof, Mr. Emerson moved to adjourn? Determined in the affirmative.

The senate adjourns until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.

THURSDAY, January 21, 1819.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read. Mr. Winchester from the committee reported a bill, entitled, An additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the speedy recovery of small debts out of court, and to repeal the acts of assembly therein mentioned; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Winchester moved the following resolutions.

Resolved, That the acts and resolutions passed during the present session be included in the edition of the laws now compiling under the resolutions of the last general assembly, and agreeably thereto.
