

The bill, entitled, An act authorising Sarah Bowen, administratrix de bonis non of Benjamin Y. Bowen, to complete the collections of the said Benjamin Y. Bowen, was read the third time, and passed.

The bill, entitled, And act to incorporate the Hagerstown Female Society for the instruction of poor children, was read the third time, passed, and severally sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The senate adjourns until to morrow morning 10 o'clock.

SATURDAY, January 30, 1819.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday, except Mr. Winchester. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Stephen Lewis, of Worcester county, was read the second, and by special order the third time, and postponed for further consideration.

The bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Elizabeth Morgan, of the state of New-Jersey, was read the second and third time by special order, and the question being put, Shall the bill pass? The yeas and nays being required appeared as follows:

AFFIRMATIVE.

So it was determined in the affirmative, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act relating to schools, and for the distribution of a certain fund in Queen-Anne's county, was read the third time, when Mr. Carmichael moved the following amendment: Strike out the title of the bill and insert, "A supplement to an act, entitled, An act for the distribution of a certain fund for the purpose of establishing free schools in the several counties therein named." 2. Strike out the preamble and first section of the bill, and insert, "Be it enacted by the general assembly of Maryland, That Thomas Turpin, Charles C. Brown, William Carmichael, William R. Stewart, Daniel C. Hopper, Isaac Winchester, Walter K. White, James Roberts, James Brown, William Gilbert, Richard I. Harrison, and John Hackett, be and are hereby appointed a board of commissioners for the purpose of distributing and applying the fund mentioned in the act to which this is a supplement." 3. In the 2d section, 2d line strike out the word "Mondays" and insert "Monday." 4. In the same line, same section, strike out "September," and insert "second Monday of October." 5. From the end of the 5th line same section strike out to the end of the section, and insert "fill up such vacancy" 6. In the second line 4th section strike out "chairman" and insert "president." 7. In the 6th line same section strike out "chairman" and insert "president" 8. Strike out 5th section and insert, "And be it enacted, that the president shall draw on the treasurer of the western shore from time to time, for such sums as may be directed by the board of commissioners, and that the said treasurer shall be authorised to pay to the order of the said president, signed by him, and countersigned by the secretary of said board, such sums as he may draw of the said fund to be applied to the education of the poor children of the county" 9. Strike out the 6th and 7th sections, and add, "And be it enacted, that all such parts of the act to which this is a supplement, which are inconsistent with this act, be and are hereby repealed."

The bill being read throughout, the question was put, Shall the bill pass with the proposed amendments? Determined in the affirmative, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act to incorporate the trustees of Big Pipe Creek Academy in Frederick county, was read the second time, and referred to Messrs. Carmichael, Taney and Gale, to consider and report thereon.

The bill, entitled, An act annulling the marriage of Theophilus Russell, and Ann his wife, of Kent county, was read the second time.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers the following bills: A bill, entitled, An act to open a road in Caroline county; a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Peter Kemp of Frederick county; a bill, entitled, An act authorising John Stevens the elder, and Nicholas Martin, administrators of James Clayland, late sheriff of Talbot county, to complete the collections of said Clayland; a resolution in favour of Daniel Jenifer, esq and a resolution requesting his excellency the governor to forward a law to the legislature of Virginia; which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table. And returns the bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Phoebe Cresap of Allegany county; the bill, entitled, An act to incorporate the Savings Bank of Baltimore; and the bill, entitled, An act authorising Aquilla G. Bowen, late one of the collectors of Calvert county, to complete his collections; severally endorsed, "read the second time and will pass." Ordered to be engrossed.

The senate resumed the consideration of the bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Stephen Lewis, of Worcester county. The question was put, Shall the bill pass? Determined in the affirmative, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Littleton Dennis Teackle of Somerset county, was read the second time.

The bill, entitled, An act annulling the marriage of Stephen Lewis and Betsy Lewis, of Worcester county, was sent to the house of delegates, with the following message:
