BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, Feb. 9, 1819.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

We propose, with the concurrence of your house, to proceed this day at 12 o'clock to an election of two directors on the part of the state for the Union Bank of Baltimore, one for the Commercial and Farmers Bank of Baltimore, two for the Farmers Bank of Maryland at Annapolis, two for the branch of said Bank at Easton, two for the Hagers-Town Bank, and one for the Elkton Bank of Maryland.

And the following resolutions: A resolution in favour of Abraham Ross; of Thomas Fairfax; of the securities of Thomas Pollard; relative to the subscription for stock, and relative to the Choptank Indian Lands; and the following bills: A bill, entitled, An act supplementary to the act for the distribution of a certain fund for the purpose of establishing free schools in the several counties therein mentioned; a bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of the children of Joseph Ennalls, of Joseph; a bill, entitled, An act to increase the pay of the judges of the orphans court of Anne Arndel county; a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Hetty Carr, of the state of Virginia; a bill, entitled, An act to authorise the justices of the levy court of Dorchester county, to levy a sum of money for the purpose therein mentioned; a bill, entitled, An act for introducing a copious supply of water into the town of Williams Port; a bill, entitled, An act for the revaluation of real and personal property in Worcester county; a bill, entitled, An act to change the place of holding the election in the third election district in Caroline county; A bill, entitled, An act extending the time allowed by law for James Egan, of Cecil county, to complete his collection; bill, entitled, A further additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the more effectual collection of the county charges in Allegany county; a bill, entitled, An act to lay out and open a road in Caroline county; a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of James Patton of Talbot county; and a bill, entitled, An act to receive and keep in force an act therein mentioned; which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill, entitled, An act to incorporate a company for the purpose of building a bridge over the north west branch of Nanticoke river at a place heretofore called Crotcher's ferry, but now known and called 'The Rising Sun, was read the second and third time by special order, and will pass with the proposed amendment, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Amendment proposed: 1. After the preamble insert "therefore." 2. Strike out the word "and" 1st line 1st section. 3. Strike out from the word "impleaded" in the 6th line 2d section. to the end of the section. 4. Strike out "April" and insert "June," 2nd line 3rd section 5. Strike out the word "for" 8th line, 8th section, and insert "of the same." 6. At the end of the 9th section add the following: "Provided thirty days notice be given to the stockholders." 7. After the word, "completed" 8th line 10th section, insert "if."

The resolution in favour of George A. Smith, was read the second and third time, by special order, and the question being put, Will the senate assent to the resolution? The yeas and nays being required appeared as follows:

Messrs. Emerson and West are appointed, on the part of the senate, to join the gentlemen who may be named on the part of your house, to count the ballots and report thereon.
