On motion of Mr. Gale, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of Samuel Clendinning of Cecil county. Ordered, That Messrs. Gale, West and Parnham, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

The bill, entitled, An act to establish a bank and incorporate a company by the name of The North and South Branch Bank of Potomac, at Old Town, Allegany county, was read the second time.

The bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of the Coxes Town school and meeting house lottery, was read the second, and by special order the third time, and will not pass.

The bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of Jemima Allen, of Prince George's county, was read the second, and by special order the third time, and will pass. The bill, entitled, An act extending the time allowed by law for James Egan of Cecil county, to complete his collection, was read the second, and by special order the third time, and will pass.

The bill, entitled, An act to increase the pay of the judges of the orphans court of Anne-Arundel county was read the second, and by special order the third time and will pass. Severally sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act to incorporate the Jackson Beneficial Society of Baltimore, was read the second, and by special order the third time, and postponed for further consideration.

The bill, entitled, An act to change the place of holding elections in the third election district in Caroline county, was read the second, and by special order the third time, and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act for the relief of James Patton of Talbot county, was read the second, and by special order the third time and postponed for further consideration.

The bill, entitled, An act to confirm the proceedings of the orphans court of Allegany county, was read the second, and by special order the third time and will pass. The bill, entitled, An act to continue in force the acts of assembly which would expire with the present session, was read the second and by special order the third time, and will pass.

The bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of John H. Debutts of Prince George's county, was read the second, and by special order the third time, and will not pass. The bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of Susannah Leach of Saint Mary's county, was read the second, and by special order the third time, and will pass.

The bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Hetty Carr of the state of Virginia, was read the second, and by special order the third time, and will not pass. Severally sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Mr. Gale from the committee reported a bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of Samuel Clendennin of Cecil county; which was read the first, and by special order the second time.

The senate adjourns until to morrow morning 10 o'clock.

## TUESDAY, February 16, 1819.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read. The engrossed bills, No. 86 to No. 97 inclusive, 140 to 147 inclusive, and No. 171, were severally read, assented to, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The senate resumed the consideration of the bill, entitled, An act for the relief of James Patton, of Talbot county; and on further consideration will not pass. The bill, entitled, A further additional supplement to an act, entitled, An act for the more effectual collection of the county charges in Allegany county, was read the second, and by special order the third time, and will pass. Severally sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The resolution in favour of John L. Kerr, was read the second time by special order.

The senate resumed the consideration of the bill, entitled, An act to incorporate the Jackson Beneficial Society of Baltimore, and on further consideration, Mr. Gale moved to strike out the first section, and the question being put, Will the senate agree to strike out the first section? The yeas and nays being required appeared as follows:

The bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Ann Stauffer of Frederick county, and her infant children, was read the second, and by special order the third time, and will not pass.
