

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a resolution in favour of Doctor Colin McKenzie, a resolution in favour of the members and officers of the legislature, and a resolution relative to the arms; which were read the first, and by special order the second and third time, assented to, and sent to the house of delegates.

Also the engrossed bills No. 160, 161, 165 to 189, inclusive; which were read, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers the following message:

The following message was sent to the house of delegates, with the bill to which it relates.

BY THE SENATE, February 15, 1820.

*Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,*

We return you the bill altering the time of holding the county courts for Worcester and Somerset, hoping on reconsideration you will pass the same.

The clerk of the house of delegates returns the engrossed bills of the senate 162, 163, 164, 190, 191, assented to.

On motion of Mr. Emerson to reconsider the resolution in favour of Capt. Solomon Frazier, the question was put, Will the senate reconsider the same? Resolved in the affirmative.

The resolution was then read, and the question put, Will the senate assent to said resolution? Determined in the negative, and sent to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates returns the bill to alter the times of holding the Worcester and Somerset county courts in their spring sessions; endorsed "will not be reconsidered."

His excellency the governor attending in the senate, Ordered, That Messrs. Maxcy and West wait on the house of delegates, and request their attendance in the senate chamber to see the laws signed by the governor, and request their attendance.

The Speaker, attended by the members of the house of delegates, appeared in the senate, and the engrossed bills from No. 104 to 191, inclusive, were presented by the speaker to his excellency the governor, who signed and sealed the same in the presence of both houses.

The senate adjourns until the first Monday in December next.
