The consideration of the bill annulling the marriage of Theophilus Russel, of Kent county, and Ann his wife, being the order of the day, was postponed until to-morrow.

On motion of Mr Johnson, Leave was given to bring in a bill to be entitled, A further supplement to an act relating to insolvent debtors in the city and county of Baltimore, and it was ordered, That Messrs Johnson, Miller and Cockey be a committee to bring in the same.

The resolution in favor of Nancy Handy, and the resolution in favor of Hezekiah Ford, were read a second time and referred to Messrs Chambers, Johnson, Kent, Quinton and Brownley.

Mr Johnson from the committee reports a bill entitled, A supplement to the act entitled, an act relating to runaway servants and slaves; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The resolution in favor of Captain Solomon Frazier, was read a second time and referred to Messrs Chambers, Johnson, Kent, Quinton and Brownley.

Mr Price from the committee to whom was referred the bill to continue in force the acts of assembly which would expire with the present session, reported the same without amendment, and the bill was read a third time and will pass.

The senate adjourned until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.

WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 6, 1822.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday, except Mr. Quinon. Mr. Chambers appeared in the senate. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The act to continue in force the acts of assembly which would expire with the present session, and the further supplement to the act for the distribution of a certain fund for the purpose of establishing free schools in the several counties therein named and for other purposes, were sent to the house of delegates.

The resolution relative to the treasurer's accounts, was read a second time and laid on the table.

The resolution relative to the auditor's accounts, was read a second time and laid on the table.

The bill relating to minors, was read a second time and laid on the table.

The bill to alter such parts of the constitution and form of government as relate to voters and qualification of voters, so far as they concern the city of Baltimore, was read a third time, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

The bill to authorize the establishment of an additional ware house in the city of Baltimore, for the inspection of tobacco, was read a third time, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

The bill for the re-valuation of real and personal property in Kent county, was read a third time, and referred to Messrs Chambers, Miller and Brownley.

The supplement to the act for founding a college on the Western Shore of this state, and constituting the same, together with Washington college on the Eastern Shore, into one University, by the name of the University of Maryland, was read a third time, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

The bill to appoint commissioners for the purpose of altering the divisional line between the first and fourth election districts in Allegany county, was read a third time, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

Mr Chambers from the committee to whom was referred the bill for the re-valuation of real and personal property in Kent county, reported the same with sundry amendments; which were read, and with the bill laid on the table.

Mr Brownley from the committee to whom was referred the resolution in favor of Benjamin G. Jones, reported the same, and the resolution was read, assented to and sent to the house of delegates.

The bill appointing commissioners for the regulation and improvement of the village of Hillsborough, in Caroline county, was read a third time and will not pass, and was sent to the house of delegates.

The bill for the benefit of Marcellus Keenè, of the city of Baltimore, was read a third time, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

Mr Price from the committee to whom was referred the bill to make valid a deed therein mentioned, reported the same, and the bill being read a third time, the question was put, Shall the bill pass? Determined in the negative, and the bill was sent to the house of delegates.

Mr Price from the committee to whom was referred the bill to regulate the pay of the justices of the orphans' court of the several counties therein named, reported the same, and the bill was read a third time, amended, and will pass with the proposed amendments. Amendments proposed. 1st. In the third line of the enacting clause, strike out the words 'Washington, Baltimore.' 2nd. In the 4th line of the enacting clause, strike out the word 'Frederick.' Sent to the house of delegates.

The senate resumed the consideration of the bill annulling the marriage of Theophilus Russell, of Kent county, and Ann his wife, being the order of the day, and after considerable debate, the question was put, Shall the bill pass? Determined in the negative.
