On motion of Mr. Claude the senate resolved itself into a committee of the whole en the bill entitled, An act taxing or lic n ing certain dealers in lotteay tickets and others, and the supplement to the act laying duties on licenses to retailers of dry goods and for other purposes, and after sometime the committee rose a d reported to the senate the said bills.

Mr. Bowie offered the following resolutions:

Resolved, That the loan aforesaid shall be reimbursable at the pleasure of the legislature, and the assessable property of Prince George's county, shall at all times be held answerable or the same.

The c.erk of the house of delegates returned the resolution relating to the loan to the Potomae company, endorsed 'dissented from.' Also the resolution relative to the wing dam at the head of the Susquehannah canal, endorsed 'will pass with the proposed amendments;' which were read, assented to; and the resolution relating to the law to regulate the inspection of totacc, endorsed 'assented to.' Also the bill relating to the acknowledgments and effect of deeds made by corporate bodies, endorsed 'will pass with the proposed amendment,' which amendment was read and assented to. Also delivered a bill entitled, An act authorising a loan of one hundred thousand dollars; which was read the first and by special order a second time and raid on the table.

The bill to alter the time of holding the county court in Somerset county, was read a third time

and will not pass, and was sent to the house of delegates.

Mr. Johnson proposed the following message:

BY THE SENATE, F.b. 22, 1822.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,—The senate return you the bill entitled, An act taxing or licensing certain dealers in lottery tickets and others, and the bill entitled, A supplement to the act laying duties on licenses to retailers of dry goods and for other purposes, rejected, because they are of opinion that the amount to be paid for the license in the city of Baltimore is not as much as it should be. The senate think it may be raised to two hundred dollars, they also think that the tax on the licence obtained elsewhere than in the city of Baltimore may be raised to fitty dollars. The

senate would respectfully suggest to your honorable body the above attrations in this bill.

The senate have also rejected the bili entitled, a supplement to the act taying duties on incenses to retailers of dry goods and for other purposes, because they are of opinion that the license of the whole sale importer may be put at fitty dollars instead of twenty dollars as provided by this bill. They are also of opinion that the words 'et cetera' in the 20 line of the 1 t section should be stricken out and that before the word 'liquors' in the same line and section, there ought to be inserted the words 'of wine, rum, brandy, whiskey and other distilled spiritous,' so as to tax only the whole-sale dealer for vending the same sort of liquor as the retail dealer is taxed for. This perhaps would not be the case if the amendment suggested was not made. The senate therefore would respectfully suggest to your hone able bod, the propriety of making these allegations in this bill.
