

Mr. Tilghman from the committee to whom was referred the bill to repeal an act, entitled, An act to alter, change and repeal such parts of the constitution and form of government of this state as relate to the division of Allegany county into eight separate election districts, passed at December session 1816, and confirmed at December session 1817, reported, that the committee had had the same under consideration, and were of opinion that it ought to pass. The bill was then read a second time and laid on the table.

The senate adjourned until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.

TUESDAY, January 25, 1825

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read. The resolution relative to the magazine in Frederick county, was read a third time, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Scott from the committee to whom was referred the bill for the benefit of William Clarke, of Montgomery county, reported, that the committee had had the same under consideration, and were of opinion that it ought to pass. The bill was then read a second, and by special order a third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

The president laid before the senate the annual report of the trustees of the Easton academy; which was read and referred to the consideration of the house of delegates.

The supplement to the act for the encouragement of learning in Cecil county, was read a third time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates.

The resolution in favour of David Middleton, was read a second time and laid on the table.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a bill, entitled, An act to incorporate the Mutual Insurance Company of Baltimore; which was read the first time and laid on the table. Also a bill, entitled, An act to repeal the 12th and 13th sections of an act for the relief of the poor of Worcester county, passed at December session 1821, chapter 145; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Quinon, Kent and Dickinson. Also a bill, entitled, An act for the division of the real estate of the heirs of Edward Wilson, and of the grantees of Lydia, his widow; and a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act to provide for the removal of lunatic paupers from the several counties of this state to the Maryland Hospital, passed at December session 1817; which were read the first time and laid on the table. Also a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Mary Snowden, of Cecil county; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Chambers, Cockey and Claude.

Also the following message:

Mr. Thomas offered the following message; which was read, assented to, and sent to the house of delegates.

BY THE SENATE, January 25, 1825.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

The senate concur in your proposition to go into the election of a United States senator to-day at 12 o'clock, and have appointed Messrs. Thomas and Miller, on the part of the senate, to count the ballots, and report the result.

The senate proceeded to the election of a senator to represent this state in the senate of the United States, Mr. Chambers having been previously excused from voting. The ballot box being prepared, the ballots were deposited therein, sealed up, and delivered to the committee of the senate, appointed to meet the committee of the house of delegates, who retired to the conference room, and after some time returned and reported, that Edward Lloyd had fifty four votes, and that Ezekiel F. Chambers, had thirty four votes, and that there was one blank vote.

Whereupon it was determined in the senate, that Edward Lloyd, esquire, having had a majority of all the votes of the attending members of the legislature, is duly elected a senator, to represent this state in the senate of the United States.

The senate adjourned until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.

WEDNESDAY, January 26, 1825.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. Mr. Stuart, President, appeared in the senate. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Mr. Scott from the committee to whom was referred the bill relating to two deeds of manumission recorded among the records of Kent county, reported, that the committee had had the same under consideration, and were of opinion that it ought to pass. The bill was then read a second time and laid on the table.

On motion by Mr. Chambers, leave was given to bring in a bill to be entitled, An act to repeal an act therein mentioned; and it was ordered, that Messrs. Chambers, Miller and Kent, should be a committee to prepare and report the same.

Mr. Chambers from the committee reported the said bill, and it was read the first time and laid on the table.

The further additional supplement to the act to alter and change the name of Elizabeth town, in Washington county, to Hagers town, and to incorporate the same, was read a third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

On motion by Mr. Tilghman. Leave was given to bring in a bill to be entitled, An act to confirm an act of the general assembly of Virginia, entitled, An act incorporating the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal Company; and it was ordered that Messrs. Tilghman, Chambers and Bowie, should be a committee to prepare and report the same.
