

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a resolution relative to the clerk of Caroline county court, which was read the first time and laid on the table.

Also, a resolution in favor of the governor, which was read the first and by special order the second and third times, and assented to.

Also, a resolution in favor of James Crawford, of Frederick county; A resolution in favor of John Blake, of Worcester county; and a resolution in favor of Conrad Ceffroth, of Franklin county, Pennsylvania, which were severally read the first time and referred to Messrs. Johnson, Orrel, Miller and Dickinson.

Also, a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Charlotte Schwartz, of Washinton county, which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Chambers, Cockey and Claude.

Also, a bill entitled an act to alter and change the names of John A. Johnson, Hezekiah Johnson, Zachra Johnson, Uriah Johnson and Catharine Johnson, to John A. Bowie, Hezekiah Bowie, Zachra Bowie, Uriah Bowie and Catharine Bowie, which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Scott, Johnson and Bowie.

Also, a bill entitled an act to limit the operation and effect of mortgages, which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Johnson. Bowie and Scott.

Also, a bill entitled a further supplement to an act entitled an act relating to salted fish brought to the city of Baltimore, passed December session, eighteen hundred and twenty-three, chapter two hundred and three, which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Scott, Bowie, Brownley, Orrell and Miller.

Also, a bill entitled an act to extend the time of taking the bond of the sheriff, of St. Mary's county, which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Scott, Dickinson and Quinton.

Also a bill entitled, an act to confirm and make valid the acts and proceedings of justices of the peace in this state; which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs Quinton, Dickinson and Brownley.

And returned the bill entitled, an act to compensate the trustees of the poor of Caroline county for their services, endorsed, "will pass."

Mr. Scott asked and obtained leave to bring in a bill to be entitled, an act to authorise the use of the testimony of the parties as witnesses in trials at law; and it was ordered, that Messrs Scott, Johnson and Orrell, should be a committee to prepare and report the same.
