Gentlemen of the House of Delegates.

The Hon. Ezekiel F. Chambers having been elected sena-  
tor of the United States, in the place of the honorable Edward  
Lloyd, resigned, we propose, with the concurrence of your house,  
that a joint letter from the president of the senate and speaker of  
the house of delegates, be forthwith forwarded to him by mail,  
informing him of his appointment.

William Hughlett. For the Elkton Bank, Adam Whann. For  
the Hagerstown Bank, John Vanlear, Jun. and David Schnebly.  
We have appointed Messrs. Worthington and Eccleston, to ex-  
amine the ballots in conjunction with the gentlemen to be named  
by the senate.
