

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a bill entitled, an act to authorise the levy courts of Baltimore and Harford counties, to build a bridge over the little Gunpowder Falls, at Lee's Mill, on the Belle Air road; which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Brownley, Johnson and Miller.

Also, a bill entitled, an act to authorise the guardian of Lambert Smith Norwood, to lease the real estate therein mentioned, which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Johnson, Brownley and Thomas.

Also, a bill entitled, an act for the relief of John Erkstine, of Washington county, which was read the first time and laid on the table.

Also a bill, entitled, An act respecting the new jail of Washington county, which was read the first time and laid on the table.

Also a bill, entitled, An act to divorce Elisha Winn and Mary Winn of the city of Baltimore, which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Chambers, Cockey, Claude, Johnson and Brownley.

Also, a bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act for the distribution of a certain fund for the purpose of establishing free schools in the several counties therein mentioned, which was read the first time and laid on the table.

And returned the bill to authorise Solomon Etting, of the city of Baltimore, to improve a lot on Pine street, in said city, endorsed, "will not pass."

And delivered a bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, a supplement to the act for the establishment and regulation of levy courts in the several counties of this state, which was read the first time and laid on the table.

Also, a bill entitled, an act to amend the constitution and form of government, as it relates to the division of Somerset county into election districts; which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Quinton, Orrell and Thomas.

Mr. Miller from the committee to whom was referred the bill regulating appeals from the magistrates' courts, reported, that the committee had had the same under consideration, and were of opinion, that it ought to pass with the following amendment, viz:—At the end of the first section, insert 'and provided also, that the party appellant, first pays or tenders payment to the officer making such levy, all the legal fees which shall have accrued upon said levy;' which amendment was read and assented to. The bill was then read a second time and laid on the table.

Mr. Thomas offered the following message, which was read, assented to, and sent to the house of delegates.
