

3d. Strike out the word "five," in the 10th line of the 3d page, and insert "fifty."

4th. Strike out the words "or fifteen dollars, two votes, or thirty-five dollars three votes, and every person who shall have paid for, and kept one scholar in said academy, for one year preceeding, and who shall also," and insert "or who shall."

5th. Add as an additional section, "And be it enacted, that if the said Henry Reister, Charles Larsh, Charles M'Elfresh and Philip Reister, shall refuse or neglect to give bond, as is hereinbefore provided for, on, or before the first day of June next, ensuing the passage of this act, then and in such case this act to be void and of no effect,

6th. Strike out all that follows the word "academy" in the ninth line of the preamble, to the end thereof.

Which amendments were read and assented to. The bill was then read a third time by special order, passed with the proposed amendments, and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill to alter and amend the constitution and form of government of this state, so as to limit the duration of the session of the general assembly; was read a third time by special order, and the question put, "shall the bill pass." The yeas and nays being required appeared as follows:

Determined in the affirmative, and the bill was sent to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a resolution in favor of the collectors of Prince George's county; which was read the first and by special order a second and third time, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

Also a bill entitled, an act to alter and amend the constitution of this state, so that the governor may be elected by the people, and to abolish the council; which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs Miller, Johnson and Dickinson.

Also a bill entitled, an act for the relief of James B. Robins, of Worcester county; which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs Quinton, Dickinson and Orrell.

Mr. Scott asked and obtained leave to bring in a bill to be entitled, an act to alter and change the name of George Stiles Dew, a minor, of the city of Baltimore, to John Holland Barney.
