The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a resolution relative to the fee bill; which was read, assented to and returned to the house of delegates.

Also a resolution in favor of William Caton; which was read, rejected, and returned to the house of delegates.

Also a resolution relative to the fourth of July; which was read, rejected, and returned to the house of delegates.

And returned the bill for the benefit of the infant children of Benjamin B. Wroth, late of Kent county, and the bill to regulate the manner of obtaining and altering public roads in Baltimore county, severally endorsed 'will pass.'

And returned the bill relating to the collectors of the public revenue, with the following message; which was read.

By the House of Delegates,

March 9, 1826.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

We return you the bill entitled an act relating to collectors of the public revenue, it is absolutely necessary that some provisions should be made in relation to the collection of public revenue. In Montgomery county, no collector was appointed for the collection of the revenue of the last year, or if appointed, he did not act—the same neglect may take place in other counties, in future, we therefore trust you will reconsider and pass the bill.

On motion the senate reconsidered the bill relating to the collectors of the public revenue. The bill was then read, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a resolution in favor of members and officers of the legislature; which was read, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

And returned the bill entitled an additional supplement to the act for the better regulation of the militia of the city of Baltimore, endorsed 'will pass with the proposed amendment,' which amendment was read and assented to.
