

was read a third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Forrest asked and obtained leave to bring in a bill to be entitled, an act relating to injunctions.—Ordered, that Messrs. Forrest, Heath and Marriott, be a committee to prepare and report the same.

The bill entitled, a supplement to the act for incorporating a society to educate and maintain poor orphan, and other destitute female children, by the name of the orphaline charity school, and to repeal the act of assembly therein mentioned, was read a third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

The resolution extending the time for commissioners, trustees and other authorities, of the several literary institutions in this state, to make report, was read a second time.

The bill to provide for the repairing a certain bridge therein mentioned, was read a second, and by special order a third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill to abolish all such parts of the constitution and form of government, as relate to the time and manner of electing the senate, and the mode of filling up vacancies in that body, so that each county, and the city of Baltimore, may have a senator to be elected immediately by the people, was read a second time, and referred to Messrs. Heath, Marriott, Rees, Harrison, and Spence.

The resolution in favour of Daniel Sprinkle, was read a third time, and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion, the bill extending the time for James Derickson, late collector of Worcester county, to complete his collections, was referred to Messrs. Spence, Heath and Johnson. On motion the bill to alter and change the location of Halls Cross Roads, and Belle Air election districts, in Harford county, and the bill to change the time of electing representatives of this state in the congress of the United States, were laid on the table.

Mr. Thomas, from the committee on Finance, to whom was referred the resolution relating to the states claim, for interest on the government of the United States, reported the same, without amendment.—The resolution was then read a third time, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Dennis, from the committee to whom was referred, the bill to authorise and empower James J. Bourne, of Calvert county, to perfect a contract entered into by himself and Susan his wife, with Nathaniel Dare, of the said county, reported, that the committee had had the same under consideration, and were of opinion, that it ought to pass, with the following amendments, viz.—1st, In the last line of the preamble, strike out the word "appeared," and insert "appear."—2d, Strike out all of the 1st section after the word "as," in the last line there—
