

1797, chapter 11, which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Heath, Lloyd and Thomas.

Also, a bill entitled, an act to provide for the making the several Turnpike Roads, and for the extension of the charters of the several Banks therein mentioned, which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on internal improvement.

Mr. Harrison and Mr. Rees asked and obtained leave not to serve on the committee to whom had been referred the bill entitled, an act for the relief of Jesse Robinson of Queen Anne's County. Mr. Dennis and Mr. Forrest were named to fill the vacancy so occasioned.

The bill entitled, an act to fix the compensation of supervisors of the public roads in Prince George's County, was read a second and by special order a third time, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

Mr. Nelson from the committee on internal improvement to whom was referred the bill entitled, an act to provide for the making the several turnpike roads, and for the extension of the charters of the several banks therein mentioned, made a favorable report upon said bill, which on motion, was ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Sewell appeared in the Senate chamber.

Mr. Heath from the committee to whom was referred the bill entitled, an act to repeal an act to declare certain tresspasses felony, and for other purposes, passed at December session 1826, chapter 260, so far as relates to Calvert and Baltimore counties, made a favorable report thereon.

Mr. Kennedy moved to amend the said bill, by striking out the words, "so far as it relates to Baltimore and Calvert counties." After some discussion, on motion, the question was put, "shall the bill lie on the table;" determined in the affirmative.

Mr. Kennedy asked and obtained leave to bring in a bill to be entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to suppress duelling, which was referred to Messrs. Kennedy, Thomas and Johnson.

On motion, the senate proceeded to the consideration of the amendments proposed by the house of delegates, to a bill entitled, an act to incorporate "The Neptune Insurance Company." The amendments were as follows, to wit; amendment first, strike out "first," and insert "second" in the seventh line of the third section. Amendment 2d. At the end of the sixth section add "at which sum the said capital shall be limited. Amendment 3d. At the end of the twelfth section add, "and no longer."
