

The bill entitled, a supplement to the act, entitled, an act granting leave to the trustees of the Lower West Nottingham congregation, in Cecil county, and their successors, to receive a deed or deeds for, and hold the lands therein mentioned, passed at November session, 1808, chapter 38, was read the third time and passed.

The bill entitled, an act to authorise the president, managers and company of the Washington and Baltimore turnpike road to construct a rail road from the city of Baltimore to the District of Columbia in the direction of the city of Washington, was about to be read the second time, when on motion of Mr. Kennedy, it was ordered to lie on the table.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered the following resolutions, to wit:

A resolution in favor of the securities of Robert H. Scharf, late collector of the state tax and of the county rate and assesment of Baltimore county. And,

A resolution proposing to furnish the states' agents for the Eastern and Western Shore, the directors of the Penitentiary, sheriffs of the several counties, and commissioners of the tax, with copies of the laws of the present session, which were severally read the first time, and referred to the committee of ways and means.

Also, a resolution authorising a grant to the heirs of Robert Chealey of a certain quantity of land lying to the westward of Fort Cumberland, in Allegany county, which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Also, a bill entitled, a supplement to the act for the re-valuation of the real and personal property in Cecil county, which was read the first time.

Also, a bill entitled, an act for the general valuation and assesment of property in this state, which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on ways and means.

Mr, Kennedy offered the following resolution, to wit;

By the Senate, March 3, 1828.

Resolved, by the General Assembly of Maryland, that the Governor and Council be, and they are hereby requested to have published without delay, in one of the newspapers in this state, the following public acts which have been passed during the present session, viz: An additional sup-
