

The bill for the relief of Sarah Cuney of Washington county, was read a third time passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill relating to servants and slaves within this State was read a second time.

Mr. Dennis moved to amend the bill by adding the following as an additional section to wit: 'And be it enacted, that this act shall extend only to Montgomery county.' Which amendment was read and after some discussion on motion of Mr. Herbert the bill was re-committed.

The president then named Messrs. Herbert and Dennis, to supply the vacancy occasioned by the absence of two of the committees.

A supplement to the act regulating fences in Charles and Alleghany counties, passed at December session 1826, chapter 82, was read a second time.

On motion of Mr. Rees, the bill to regulate the entering or recording satisfaction of any judgment or decree entered or endorsed in any court of this State, was referred to Messrs. Rees, Heath and Thomas.

On motion of Mr. Heath, the bill to incorporate the Maryland company for insurance on lives granting annuities and other purposes, was referred to Messrs. Heath, Herbert and Rees.

Mr. Kennedy made a favourable report upon the bill for the relief of Fitz King, of Baltimore county. The said bill was then read a third time and passed.

Mr. Herbert from the committee on internal improvement made a favourable report upon the bill for the repairing of a bridge over the main falls of Patapsco on the deer park road in Baltimore county. The said bill was then read a second and by special order a third time and passed.

Mr. Herbert from the committee on internal improvement made an unfavourable report upon the bill to incorporate the Oxford rail road company. The said bill was then read a second and by special order a third time and rejected.

The bill for the benefit of Sally Elzey and William Long of Somerset county, was read a second time and ordered to be engrossed, and having been engrossed, was read a third time and passed.
