On the further reading of the bill Mr. Smith, moved to amend the 14th section by inserting after the word “treasury,” in the 4th line, the words “for the use of the State,” and the question was put, and determined in the affirmative.

Mr. Smith, moved further to amend the said 14th section by adding at the end of it the following words, “and the right of the General Assembly, to appropriate to the use of the State any excess of profits in lieu of the reduction of tolls over and above the clear annual profits of ten per centum allowed by this act to the said company is hereby reserved—provided that such appropriation upon the part of the State, shall at no time exceed ten per centum per annum upon the amount of the costs of the construction of said road, and the question was put, and determined in the affirmative.

On the further reading of the bill Mr. Heath, moved to amend the 16th section by striking out the following words, viz: “the manner of adjusting and settling all accounts against the company and also,” and the question was put and determined in the affirmative.

On the further reading of the bill Mr. Forrest, moved to amend the 20th section by striking out the words, “the said” in the 2d line and insert in lieu thereof, the words, “any road,” and the question was put, and determined in the affirmative.

Mr Forrest, moved further to amend the said 20th section as follows, strike out the word “said,” in the 4th line and insert in lieu thereof, the word “the,” and after the word “company,” insert the words “hereby incorporated,” and the question was put, and determined in the affirmative.

Mr. Forrest, moved further to amend the said 20th section by striking out the words “by said company,” in the 3d line and the question was put, and determined in the affirmative.
