

Mr. Sewell, presented a petition from the inhabitants of Abingdon in Harford county, praying for an act to incorporate the town of Abingdon, which was read and referred to Messrs. Sewell, Smith, and Heath.

Mr. Herbert, from the committee, made a favorable report upon the bill, entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to authorise the Levy court of Frederick county to levy a sum of money for the purposes therein mentioned, passed at December session 1825, chap. 84

The said bill was then read a second, and by special order, a third time, passed and returned to the House of Delegates.

On motion of Mr. Smith, the engrossed bill entitled, an additional supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a Turnpike road from the City of Baltimore to Havre-de-Grace, was read a third time, by special order, passed and sent to the House of Delegates.

On motion of Mr. Heath, the engrossed bill entitled, an act to divorce John B. Scott, of the City of Baltimore from Adeline his wife, was read a third time by special order, passed and sent to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Kennedy, submitted the following resolution which was read the first time.

Resolved, that the clerk of the Council immediately advertise three times in all the news papers printed in Annapolis, in two newspapers printed in Baltimore, and in one newspaper printed in Frederick and Hagers Town for proposals for printing covering with blue paper and stitching, the usual number of laws and resolutions, passed at the present session of the Legislature, embracing an index, and marginal notes, and within twenty days from the passage of this resolution he shall contract for said printing, covering and stitching on the lowest and best terms, provided that the contractors shall enter into bond and security, to deliver the said laws at the City of Annapolis, within thirty days from the close of the present session.

Mr. Herbert, from the committee, on internal improvement made a favorable report upon the resolution relative to the practicability and expediency of improving the navigation of Pocomoke river.

The said resolution was then read a second, and by special order, a third time, assented to and was returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Thomas, from the committee, on ways and means made a favorable report upon the resolutions relative to the States claim, on the government of the United States, for interest on expenditures in the last war with Great Britain.
