

Frederick county, to levy a sum of money, to erect a Bridge over the Monocacy river was read a third time and passed as amended.

On motion of Mr. Kennedy, the resolution relative to advertising for proposals for printing, covering and stitching, the usual number of laws and resolutions, passed at the present session, embracing an index and marginal notes, was ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.
