

relief of John T. Wallace of Washington county, being entitled to a third reading was further postponed until Thursday next the 26th inst.

Mr. Kennedy presented three petitions counter to the petitions of sundry inhabitants of Washington county, praying for a change in the organization of the levy court, which were severally read and referred to the consideration of the house of delegates.

The bill entitled, an act to authorise the building of a bridge across the severn river, from a point on the land of Thomas R. Cross, to the county road on the opposite shore, leading to Ashpaw's landing on Marley creek, was read a third time, and the question put, shall the bill pass. Determined in the affirmative, and the bill was returned to the house of delegates.

The senate proceeded to the consideration of the bill entitled, an act to relinquish the right of the state, to the personal property of Elizabeth Jackson, deceased, and to transfer the same to Mary Elizabeth Ringgold. The bill having been read a third time, and after some discussion, the question was put, Shall the bill pass? The yeas and nays being required, appeared as follows:

Determined in the affirmative. So the bill was passed and returned to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Smith, the bill entitled, an act to authorise the Governor and Council of Maryland, to appoint the inspectors of flour of this state, passed at December session, eighteen hundred and twenty-five, chapter one hundred and seventy-four, was recommitted, and the committee enlarged by the addition of Messrs. Forrest and Thomas.

Mr. Kennedy presented a petition from Daniel A. Bertolet, of Pennsylvania, praying to be authorised to execute certain deeds for property sold in Boonsborough, Washington county, by George Boone, deceased, which was read and referred to the committee on invalid deeds.
