

Saturday, Feb. 28, 1829.

**The Senate met.** Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill to incorporate the Maryland Society, for promoting the culture of the Vine, passed by the Senate yesterday, was returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Heath asked and obtained leave to bring in a bill to be entitled, an additional supplement to the act for enlarging the powers of the Chancery court, ordered that Messrs. Heath, Harrison and Dennis, be a committee to prepare and report the same.

On motion of Mr. Heath, the bill entitled, an act supplementary to an act for the opening of Pratt street, passed at December session 1817, chapter 17, was read a third time by special order, passed and was returned to the House of Delegates.

On motion of Mr. Forrest, the bill entitled, an act to authorise the laying out and opening a road through a part of Frederick, Anne Arundel and Montgomery counties, was read a third time by special order.

Mr. Kennedy, moved to reconsider the bill for the purpose of amending the title, and the question was put, and determined in the negative.

The question was then put, shall the bill as amended pass. Determined in the affirmative, and the bill was returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Heath, from the committee reported a bill entitled, an additional supplement to the act for enlarging the powers of the Chancery court, which was read the first time and ordered to be printed.

The bill entitled, an act to regulate judicial proceedings in this State being entitled to a second reading was on motion ordered to lie on the table.

On motion of Mr. Thomas, the bill entitled, an act to alter the time for the transaction of equity business in the first judicial district of this state, and for other purposes, was read a third time by special order.

Mr. Thomas, moved to amend the bill by striking out the 4th section, which is in these words, '4th section, And be it enacted that it shall be the duty of the Clerks of the several county courts of the said district to furnish the Grand Jury of the several counties of the said district with the number of days, which each judge shall attend, by and in virtue of this law, and it shall be the duty of the court of the
