

Which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on pensions.

A bill entitled, a supplement to an act to provide for the repair of public roads in Montgomery county, passed at December session 1826, chapter 227.

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Dennis, Kennedy and Sewell.

A bill entitled, an act to authorise Samuel R. Turner, of Kent county, to cut a canal or head race, and to raise a dam or dams, through and on certain lands therein mentioned.

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Rees, Harrison, and Dennis.

A bill entitled, an act to establish a public road in Charles county.

Which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Thomas, Heath and Herbert.

A bill entitled, an act to authorise the Levy Court of Frederick county to levy a sum of money for the purpose of building a bridge over the Catoctin Creek in said county.

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Kennedy, Whiteley and Rees.

A bill entitled, an act to lay out and open a road from the town of Westminster, in Frederick county, to the eastern edge of the fording place on the Western fork of the Patapsco Falls, near Wampler's Mills, in Baltimore county.

Which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Smith, Heath and Herbert.

A bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to authorise the levy court of Frederick county to levy a sum of money to purchase a tract of land, and build a house thereon, for the use of the paupers, and sell the present poor house of said county, and for other purposes.

Which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Thomas, Rees and Sewell.

A bill entitled, an act to open a road from Calvert's Mill, near the Woodyard, to intersect the road commonly known as, and called 'the new cut road,' near Bell's Meeting House, in Prince George's county.

Which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Herbert, Heath and Thomas.

And a bill entitled, an act to exempt the wearing apparel of deceased persons from appraisement and exposure to sale by executors and administrators.
