Mr. Harrison, moved to amend the same by striking out from the word 'county,' to the end thereof, and inserting in lieu thereof, the following words 'and his securities be, and the same are hereby suspended, until the April term of Cecil county court, in the year 1830, provided the said Robert C. Lusby, and his securities, within forty days from the passage of this resolution, give bond to the State, with two good and sufficient additional securities, to be taken and approved by the treasurer of the Eastern Shore for the payment of such sum as may now be due to the state by said Robert C. Lusby, and his securities.'

Which amendment was read and assented to.

The question was then put, will the Senate assent to the resolution as amended.

Determined in the affirmative.

The bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to authorise the New Castle and Frederick town turnpike company, to make a Rail Road, from French town, on Elk river, to the Delaware line, in a direction towards New Castle, passed at December session 1827, chapter 207, being entitled to a second reading, was ordered to lie on the table.

The bill entitled, an act incorporating a company for the improvement of the public road from the city of Frederick to Harper's Ferry, was read a third time, and passed.

Mr. Kennedy, moved that the Senate adjourn.
