

On motion of Mr. Kennedy, the said resolution was referred to a committee consisting of Messrs. Kennedy, Forrest and Heath.

The bill entitled, an act for the relief of Elijah Norris, of Harford county, was read a third time and rejected.

The clerk of the house of Delegates delivered the resolution in favor of Thomas Jones, of Anne Arundel county, a soldier of the revolutionary war, heretofore rejected by the senate, with the following message, which was read.

By the House of Delegates, March 11 1829.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

We return you the resolution in favor of Thomas Jones, of Anne Arundel county, indulging the hope that you will be satisfied upon an examination of the additional evidence presented to you in the case of the propriety of reconsidering and passing the same.

On motion of Mr. Herbert, the senate then reconsidered the resolution in favor of Thomas Jones, of Anne Arundel county, a soldier of the revolutionary war, and the same was ordered to lie on the table.

And returned the bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Louis M^r Lane, of the state of Delaware endorsed 'will not pass.'

And also, returned the bill entitled, an act to reduce into one, the several acts relative to the times of holding the court of appeals and the several county courts in this state, and for other purposes, endorsed 'will pass' with the proposed amendments.

Amendments Proposed.

1st, Strike out in the 5th and 6th lines, of 6th section, the words, 'in Cecil county on the first Monday in April and September,' and insert, 'in Cecil county, on the first Monday of April, and the third Monday of October.'

2d, Strike out in the 6th and 7th lines, of the 6th section, the words, 'in Queen Ann's county, on the first of May and third Monday in October,' and insert
