

On motion of Mr. Smith, the engrossed bill entitled, an act to provide for the distribution of that part of the school fund, which is appropriated to Baltimore county, was read a third time by special order, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

The bill entitled, a supplement to the act to incorporate companies to make certain turnpike roads through the counties of Montgomery, Frederick and Washington, and for other purposes, was read a third time.

Mr. Forrest, moved to amend the same by adding at the end of the bill the following proviso, 'and provided also that all tolls received from the said road clear of expenditures for necessary repairs shall be used in perfecting and completing that part of the road leading from Leesborough to Rockville, and the President of said company shall in the month of December in each year, return under oath to the Treasurer of the Western Shore, a full and true account of the receipts of tolls, and the necessary expenditures of the company,' which amendment was read and assented to, the said bill was then ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled, an act to make valid a deed of bargain and sale and release from John G. Mitchael, Morningstar, of the state of Ohio, to Jacob Poe, of Frederick county, was taken up for a third reading and on motion was ordered to lie on the table.

The engrossed resolution relative to the arrears of pension due revolutionary pensioners,

Was read a third time by special order, and the question put 'will the Senate assent to the same.'
