

The said resolution was then read a second, and by special order, a third time, and assented to.

Mr. Lloyd, from the same committee, made a favorable report upon the resolutions relative to the re-binding, repairing or transcribing certain land record books of Prince George's county. The said resolution was then read a second time, and laid on the table.

Mr. Kennedy, from the committee, made a favorable report upon the bill, entitled an act for founding a college near Emmittsburg, in Frederick county, with the following amendments, viz.

Amendments proposed—Section 3, 5th line, strike out the words "at all times hereafter, forever."

Sec. 5th, 4th line, after the word "doctors," insert "except doctors of medicine." Same section, 5th line, after the word degrees, insert "except doctors of medicine."

Add the following as an additional section:

*"And be it enacted,* That the said principal and vice principal, hereafter named, shall hold their offices, and execute the several duties thereof, until the end of the next session of the General Assembly of Maryland, and no longer."

Which amendments were read; and

On motion of Mr. Forrest, the said bill, with the proposed amendments, were ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Dennis, from the Committee on Claims, made a favorable report upon the resolution in favor of Edward Smith, of Dorchester county.

The said resolution was then read a second time; and

On motion of Mr. Harrison, was ordered to lie on the table.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered a resolution directing one set of the acts of Congress to be furnished by the Librarian to the Adjutant General; which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Sewell, Rees and Kennedy.

Also a resolution in favor of the representatives and securities of Samuel G. Osborn, a former sheriff of Harford county; which was read the first time, and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Also a resolution in favor of the trustees of the New Market Academy, in Dorchester county; which was read the first time, and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Also a bill, entitled an act to incorporate the trustees of the Female Orphan Society of Annapolis; which was read
