Also, a bill, entitled, an act to authorise the transcribing of certain dockets and record books of Harford county; which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Sewell, Kennedy and Smith.

Also, a bill, entitled, an act to establish and confirm certain acts, done by a justice of the peace in Cecil county, which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Lloyd, Rees and Dennis.

Also, a bill, entitled, an act to provide for the building of two fire proof offices in Bell-Air, Harford county, for the preservation of the records of said county, which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Sewell, Rees, and Kennedy.

Also a bill, entitled, an act to exempt certain property in the city of Baltimore, from taxation; which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Heath, Smith, and Dennis.

Also a bill, entitled an additional supplement to the act entitled, an act for the better regulation of the Militia of Harford county; which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Sewell, Heath, and Smith.

Also a bill, entitled, an act for the relief of William Clare, late collector of the tax for Calvert county; which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Forrest, Rees, and Sewell.

Also a bill, entitled, an act to repeal the act, entitled, an act for regulating and inspecting weights and measures used in this state, passed at December session, 1825, chap. 206; which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Heath, Forrest, and Herbert.
