SATURDAY, January 1st, 1831.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday.

The proceedings of yesterday were read,

Mr. Sewell offered the following message, which was read, assented to, and sent to the house of delegates.

By the Senate, Jan. 1st, 1831.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

The senate propose an interchange of services between the Reverend Mr. Blanchard, who is appointed to perform divine services in the senate, and the Reverend Gentleman appointed by your House.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a bill, entitled, An act authorising Cornelia A. Howard, Guardian of John E. Howard, of the city of Baltimore, to lease certain property therein mentioned; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Heath, Smith and Sewell.

Also a bill, entitled, An act to alter and change the names of Levin Wall Hall, his wife Rose Anne Hall, and his daughter Mary Elizabeth Hall, of Dorchester county; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Spence, Sewell and Whiteley.

Mr. Harrison from the joint committee, delivered the following report; which was read the first, and by special order a second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading, and having been engrossed was then read a third time by special order, the report concurred in, and the resolution therein contained assented to.

The committee appointed in conjunction with a like committee on the part of the house of delegates to contract for the public printing of the current session.

Report, That they have contracted with Jonas Green of the city of Annapolis, on the following conditions, to wit:

First, For the journals, at one dollar and eighty cents per page, sixteen hundred copies.

Second, For the bills at seventy cents per page, one hundred and eleven copies.

Third, For reports and documents at seventy cents per page, one hundred and eleven copies.

Fourth, For broad-sides at seven dollars per sheet, one hundred and eleven copies.

Fifth, For the laws, at two dollars and forty cents per page, sixteen hundred copies.
