

The resolutions requesting the Senators and Representatives of this State in the Congress of the United States, to use their exertions to procure appropriations for the establishment and support of proper Buoys, at the entrances of the Rivers Nanticoke, Manokin, Annemessix, Pocomoke and Wicomico, in the collection districts of Snowhill and Vienna, also assented to by the Senate on yesterday, was returned to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following resolutions :

A resolution in favor of Thomas Ashcom, Sheriff of Queen-Anne's county; which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on Finance.

A resolution, authorising and requiring the Register of the Land-office of the Western Shore, to issue to Richard Coe, of Prince George's county, a common warrant for fifty acres of vacant land.

A resolution, requiring the Treasurer of the Western Shore, to pay to Reuben Ross, in half yearly payments, a sum of money, equal to the half-pay of a private. And

A resolution in favor of Benjamin Howard, a revolutionary soldier; which were severally read, and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Also, the following bills :

A bill, entitled, an act for the revaluation of the real and personal property in Queen-Anne's county; which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Emory, Sappington and Pigman.

A bill, entitled, an act to repeal an act, entitled, an act to abolish imprisonment for debt on certain judgments, rendered by Justices of the Peace, passed at December session, 1850, chapter 155; which was read, and referred to the committee on Judicial proceedings.

A bill, entitled, an act for the relief of Sarah Houston, of Frederick county; which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on Finance.

A bill, entitled, an act to divorce Ann H. Drake, of the City of Baltimore, from her husband Matthew Drake; which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Mayer, Taney and Hughlett.

Mr. Pigman, from the committee on Insolvency, to which was referred the petition of John A. Stanbery, reported, a bill, entitled, an act for the relief of John A. Stanbery, of the City of Baltimore.

The bill, entitled, an act to amend the Charter of the City of Annapolis, and to exempt the property in the said City, belonging to the Corporation thereof from the payment of
