

The bill was then read the second, and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Mayer, leave was given to bring in a bill to be entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to reduce into one the several acts of assembly, respecting elections and to regulate such elections.

Ordered, that Messrs Mayer, Claude and Sappington be a committee to prepare and report the same.

The bill entitled, an act to alter the time of holding the election of electors of the Senate of Maryland, was read the third time, rejected and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Dennis from the committee to which was referred, a bill entitled, an act to record the deed therein mentioned, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration and were of opinion it not to pass.

The bill was then read the second, and by special order the third time, rejected and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Emory from the committee on pensions to which was referred the bill entitled, an act for the relief of sudy poor persons in the counties therein mentioned, reported favorably thereon.

The bill was then read the second, and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Dennis from the committee to which was referred, the bill entitled, an act relating to free negroes and slaves, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration and were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendments, which were read and assented to.

In the 12th line of the 1st section, strike out the word, "committee" and insert the word "arrested."

In the 26th line of the 7th section, after the words "Baltimore city," add the following words: "and Annapolis city."

The bill and the amendments were ordered to lie on the table.
