

Mr. Dennis from the committee on finance, to which was referred a resolution requiring the treasurer of the Western Shore to pay to his excellency the governor, the sum of money therein mentioned.

A resolution in favor of the warden of Baltimore county jail, a resolution in favor of John Hutchinson, of Dorchester county, and a resolution in favor of Jonathan Kershner, of Hagerstown, and James P. Bayless of Baltimore city, reported favorably thereon. They were severally read the second time.

On motion of Mr. Dennis, the resolution requiring the treasurer of the Western Shore, to pay to his excellency the governor, the sum of money therein mentioned, the resolution in favor of John Hutchinson of Dorchester county, and the resolution in favor of Jonathan Kershner, of Hagerstown, and James P. Bayless, of Baltimore city, were severally read the third time, by special order, and assented to.

Mr. Wootton from the committee to which was re-committed the bill entitled, an act to explain an act of assembly, passed at December session 1831, chapter 323, entitled, an act relating to free negroes and slaves, with the amendments heretofore proposed, reported that the committee had had said bill and amendments under consideration, and were of opinion the bill ought to pass, without amendment.

It was read the second, and by special order the third time, and passed.

Mr. Dennis from the committee on finance, to which was referred the resolution in favor of James Harrison, (of William) reported that the committee had had said resolution under consideration, and were of opinion it ought to be dissented from. It was read the second time.

The senate adjourned until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.
