

The bill entitled, an act to divorce Elisa Selby, of the City of Baltimore, from her husband James Selby, *a mensa et thoro*, was read the third time and passed.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following bills:

A bill entitled, an act to authorise the Governor and Council to appoint one justice of the levy court for each election district, in Frederick county, which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Sappington, Pigman and Page.

A bill entitled, a further additional supplement to an act entitled, an act for quieting possessions, enrolling conveyances, and securing the estates of purchasers, which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on judicial proceedings.

A bill entitled, an act to authorise the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, to reduce the width of a part of Holland street, which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Morris, Wootton and Pigman.

A bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act relating to free negroes and slaves, passed at December session, 1831, chapter 323, which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Dennis, Wootton and Emory.

Mr. Page from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to repeal in part an act entitled, an act to prohibit the use of gill nets in the Potomac and Patuxent rivers, during the period therein mentioned, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second time.

The senate adjourned until Monday morning 10 o'clock.

MONDAY, February 18, 1833.

The senate met. Present the same members as on Saturday. Mr. Mayer appeared in the senate chamber and took his seat. The proceedings of Saturday were read.
