On motion of Mr. Claude the following message was read and adopted:

On motion of Mr. Sappington the following bills were read by their titles and the consideration thereof indefinitely postponed.

A bill entitled, an act to regulate private banking.

A bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Allegany improving company.

A bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Anthony Thompson of Dorchester county.

A bill entitled, an act relating to the Chesapeake and Ohio canal company and the Baltimore and Ohio rail road company.

A bill entitled, a further supplement to the act passed at December session 1831, chapter 323, entitled, an act relating to free negroes and slaves.

On motion of Mr. Wootton, the bill entitled, an act to authorise Clement McWilliams of St. Mary's county to bring certain slaves into this state, was read the third time rejected and returned to the house of Delegates.
