The bill was then read through, and

Ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Mr. Mayer presented the memorial of Charles W. Karthaus and others, praying a certain disposition of the fund received under the act relating to the importation of passengers.

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Mayer, Morris and Emory.

Mr. Claude from the committee on the library to which was referred the resolution directing the librarian to furnish two bound copies of the index to the laws of Maryland from 1818 to 1825, and from 1826 to 1831, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time and assented to.

On motion of Mr. Mayer,

Leave was granted to the committee on judicial proceedings to prepare and report a bill to be entitled, an act relating to mortgages.

The Senate adjourned until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.
