

The expenses of the establishment at this time are about \$100 per week, the expense of heat alone (from the bad construction of the flues) being about \$40 per week.

The institution was found in such a state previous to its occupation by the board of Visitors that they were compelled in the course of the last summer to commence certain needful repairs, amounting to \$4000 including insurance on the building.

The board in anticipation of the charge that was to devolve on them at the beginning of the year, purchased such furniture for the accommodation of the patients as they thought was absolutely required, amounting to \$1300: and yet only those rooms are furnished, (and these with bare necessaries, as the committee will recollect) which are occupied by the inmates of the house. The parlours and other rooms throughout the house remain unfinished, the grates or stoves, being for the most part, even worn out or good for nothing.

N. B. The above estimate does not include the repair of the *oldest part* of the west wing, this would require about \$10,000, but at present it is not necessary and until the necessary improvements are made, this may remain as it is.
