

WEDNESDAY, December 31st 1834.

Present the same senators as on yesterday.

On motion of Mr. Montgomery,

The senators present, proceeded to the election of a President.

On motion of Mr. Hughlett, Mr. Sappington was put in nomination.

The ballot box was prepared, and the ballots deposited therein, and on examination thereof by the clerk, it appeared there had been eight votes given, seven of which were for Mr. Sappington, and there was one blank.

Whereupon it was declared that the Honorable Thomas Sappington, is duly elected President of the Senate.

He accordingly took the chair.

On motion of Mr. Montgomery,

The senate proceeded to the election of the clerks. When Joseph H. Nicholson was appointed clerk, Mr. John N. Watkins assistant clerk, and Mr. Isaac Hines committee clerk.

They were severally qualified as such.

On motion of Mr. Hughlett,

The following order was read and adopted.

Ordered, that Mr. Andrew Slicir, be appointed Messenger—and Mr. Samuel Peaco, Door Keeper to the Senate for and during the present session.

They were severally qualified as such.

The Senate adjourned until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.
