

It was read the second time.

On motion of Mr. Mayer,

Leave was granted to the committee on judicial proceeding, to prepare and report a bill to be entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act for the relief of sundry insolvent debtors of this state, passed at November session 1805, chapter 110,

Mr. Emory from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act for the relief of the widow and children of John Cummins deceased, late of the state of Delaware, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration and were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendment.

Which was read and assented to.

Strike out after the end of the 5th line on the 5th page and 2nd section, all the remainder of that section, after the word "thereof."

The bill was then read the second, and by special order the third time and passed.

The senate adjourned until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.

The bill entitled, an act for the relief of the widow and children of John Cummins, deceased, late of the state of Delaware, also passed by the senate on yesterday, with an amendment, were returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Pigman from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Weverton Manufacturing Company, reported favorably thereon.
