Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Wilson, Pigman and Emory.

A bill entitled, an act to make public a certain road in Baltimore county.

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Morris, Mayer and Claude.

A bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Richard N. Snowden.

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on judicial proceedings.

A bill entitled, an act authorising the commissioners of Washington county, to pay certain claims therein mentioned.

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Pigman, Wootton and Forrest.

Mr. Forrest from the committee on judicial proceedings, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act for the relief of Margaret Dods, of Frederick county, reported, that the committee had had said bill under consideration, and were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendment, which was read and assented to:

Strike out the 11th line in the 1st section.

It was then read the second and by special order the third time and passed
