A bill entitled, A further supplement to the act entitled an act to authorise a lottery, to raise a sum of money for the purpose of finishing the Roman Catholic Church in Frederick Town, in Frederick county,

A bill entitled, An act increasing the width of a part of Light Street, in the city of Baltimore, passed at December session, 1830, chapter 214,

A bill entitled, An act to alter and amend the lines dividing the fifth and sixth election districts, in Anne Arundel county,
