

ted An act appointing commissioners to build a bridge over the Little Falls of Gunpowder in Harford and Baltimore counties, passed at December session 1831, chapter 101,

And the bill entitled, An act to authorise the building of a bridge over the head waters of St. Mary's River in St. Mary's county, and the bill entitled An act for the benefit of persons hiring or renting stoves, also severally passed by the senate on yesterday,

And the bill entitled, An act to open and make public a road from Cole's warehouse to St. Aloysius Chapel, in St. Mary's county,

And the bill entitled, An act to close up the old road and to open another therein mentioned, in Anne-Arundel county,

Severally rejected by the senate on yesterday, were returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Wootton from the committee on internal improvement to which was referred the bill entitled, An act to provide for completing a new map and geological survey of this state, reported favorably thereon,

It was read the second time, and

On motion of Mr. Emory,

It was made the order of the day for to-morrow (Thursday,) the 12th inst.

On motion of Mr. Morris,

The last amendment proposed by the House of Delegates, to the bill entitled, An act to authorise the appointment of a commissioner of loans,

Which was reconsidered by the senate on Monday, was read and assented to.

Mr. Hughlett from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled A supplement to the act, to regulate fences in Dorchester and Caroline counties, passed at December session 1833, chapter 119, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration and were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendments,

Which were read and assented to:

Sec. 1st. 3d line before county add "Caroline."

Strike out the word "county" wherever it occurs in the bill, and insert the word "counties."

After the word "Dorchester" in the last line of the bill, insert the words "and Caroline."

The bill was then read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the House of Delegates.
