Resolved, That there be paid to said director, and persons respectively, for their respective services from time to time, during the work, such compensation as the Governor and Council shall deem proper and reasonable; and that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay the same upon the orders of the Governor.

Resolved, That the Governor and Council are hereby authorised to allow, and cause to be paid in manner aforesaid, on application of the director, during the progress of the work, and to be paid to him such amounts as they may judge to be necessary for, or to meet expenses of said collating and digesting.

Resolved, That the Governor and Council be authorised to fill any vacancy that shall occur in the place of director or any of the persons aforesaid by death, resignation, or otherwise.

Mr. Morris from the committee on finance, to which was referred the resolution in favor of Church Hill Academy, reported that the committee had had said resolution under consideration, and were of opinion it ought not to be assented to;

It was read the second and by special order the third time and dissented from.
