At December Session, 1835.

MARYLAND—To wit:

At a Session of the General Assembly of Maryland, begun and held in the City of Annapolis, on the 21st Monday in December, being the twenty eighth day of the month, in the year one thousand, eight hundred and thirty five, the following Senators appeared in the Senate Chamber, and took their seats, to wit: Dennis Claude, William Hughlett, James Montgomery, Samuel G. Osborn, Thomas Sappington and Henry P. C. Wilson, Esquires.

On motion of Mr. Sappington,

The Senators present adjourned until to-morrow 10 o'clock.

TUESDAY, December 29th 1835.

Present the same Senators as on yesterday. John H. Chapman, John C. Groome and Charles F. Meyer, Esquires, appeared in the Senate Chamber and took their seats.

A quorum being present, on motion of Mr. Sappington, the Senate proceeded to the election of a President.

On motion of Mr. Sappington, Mr. Chapman, was put in nomination.
