

SATURDAY, February 13th, 1836.

The Senate met. Present the same Senators as on yesterday.

The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The message and accompanying documents] received yesterday from his excellency Governor Veazy, were sent to the house of delegates.

Mr. Pigman from the committee to which leave was granted, reported a bill entitled, A supplement to an act entitled, an act for the preservation and repair of that part of the United States road within the limits of the state of Maryland.

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Page from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to repeal an act entitled, an act regulating fences in Dorchester and Caroline counties, passed at December session 1833, ch. 119, and the supplement thereto, passed at December session 1834, chapter 225, so far as they relate to Dorchester county, reported favorably thereon

It was read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the House of Delegates.

On motion of Mr. Montgomery,

The resolution relative to removing obstructions on the Susquehanna River were read the third time assented to and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Hughlett from the committee on revolutionary claims to which was referred the resolutions in favor of Sarah Deaver, Nancy Williams, Mary Alexander and Robert Wilmot, reported favorably thereon.

They were severally read the second and by special order the third time, assented to, and returned to the House of Delegates.

On motion of Mr. Mayer,

The bill entitled, an act relating to the jurisdiction and powers now vested in Justices of the Peace for the City of Baltimore.

Was read the third time by special order passed and sent to the house of delegates.

Mr. Mayer presented the memorial of Benjamin C. Howard and others praying the passage of an act to condemn and fix the width of Madison street in Baltimore, between Howard street and York Avenue.

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Mayer, Morris and Wootton.
