Leave was granted to the committee on colored population, to prepare and report a bill to be entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act relating to persons of color, who are to be free after the expiration of a term of years, passed December session 1833.

Mr. Hughlett from the committee on revolutionary claims to which was referred the resolution in favor of Samuel Baldwin, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time assented to and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Morris from the committee to which was referred the memorial of William E. Mayhew, and others, reported a bill entitled, an act to establish the Baltimore Print Works,

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Wootton from the committee on internal improvement to which was referred the preamble and resolution relative to so much of the act of 1834, as provides for the completion of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal to Cumberland and for other purposes, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second time.

Mr. Morris from the committee to which was referred the resolution in favor of the securities of Marcy Fountain late collector of Caroline county reported unfavorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, dissented from and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Hughlett from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, a supplement to an act passed at December session 1825, chapter 36, relating to the Trustees of the alms house for Caroline county, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time passed and returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Morris from the committee on finance to which was referred the bill entitled, an act relating to certain Banks in the city of Baltimore, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration and were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendment,

Which was read and adopted.
