asked the opinion of the upper house, whether  
the warrant should be signed yea, or no; and  
resolved in the Negative till the cause were  
known, whereupon the Speaker rose and  
said it was but for the Statute of England.

The Assembly is adjourned till nine a clock  
to morrow morning at Mr Slyes house.
